School Leadership Team Meeting **Meeting Minutes** Virtual Platform - Zoom Thursday, June 10, 2021 5:30 pm - 7.30 pm

1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 5.35pm.

2. Review and approval of May 25, 2021 SLT meeting minutes

The draft minutes from the May 25, 2021 meeting had been shared in advance. A motion was made to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded. All were in favor; none abstained.

The approved minutes will be published on the school and PTA websites.

3. Creating a Vision Statement

Sonita explained the importance of Q300 building and documenting the vision for the school by working with teachers, parents and the school community to get their engagement and contribution.

Kiera granted permission for Anna Milonakis to address the SLT. Anna spoke about the significance of building this Vision Statement collaboratively and that she appreciates Sonita's openness in allowing us to all work together to develop the vision.

The SLT watched a 5 minute video from Edwin Mora on what is a Vision Statement.













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Sonita had organized an activity with the staff to identify "what qualities would we want a Q300 graduate to possess." The SLT completed the same activity, and came up with the following words/phrases (grouped where similar):

- Motivated and well-equipped to meet goals
- Academically prepared
- Critically thinker
- Goal-oriented
- Sense of curiosity about the world around them
- Compassionate community members
- Ethical
- Truth and justice seeker
- Social justice
- Integrity
- Advocate for those who can't or don't want to speak for themselves
- Engaged and involved in civic issues / social issues
- Co-operative
- Understanding what it means to be part of a community
- Leadership that encompasses these qualities
- Independent thinkers
- Sense of curiosity about the world around them
- Inclusive and respectful
- **Empathetic**

The SLT then summarized this in the following 5 key points:

- Leadership
- Critical, independent, curious thinker
- Compassionate community members
- Collaborative problem solver
- Socially and academically goal oriented

The SLT compared the above words/phrases with the draft Vision Statement that the staff had developed. Various suggestions and discussions were had, including:













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- Replacing the word authenticity with integrity.
- Replacing the word impact with create.
- Robust discussion regarding the use and meaning of the words inquisitive and curious.
- Question asked about the use of the word "stakeholders" which, in the corporate world, means investors/senior staff or others you need to provide something to. However, Sonita explained that in relation to education, this refers to staff, teachers, parents and other supporting community members and bodies.

A revised draft Vision was developed (amendments made to the staff draft), and will be taken forward for more broader engagement in the school community.

4. Review action steps for 2021-2022 school year

The SLT broke out into their CEP goal groups and reviewed the updated CEP goals that had been input into the I-plan portal.

No changes required to the ELA and Math goals as input into the I-plan portal.

For Science, CEP team had recommended a wording change "to enhance depth of thinking" but the SLT CEP Science goal team revised the wording and will take it back to the CEP team.

The SLT CEP Social-emotional team need to meet again to discuss their goals.

Updates to the CEP goals are to be made in the I-plan portal by June 15th.

5. **Principal Updates**

a) Open houses

Communications have been sent out about the open houses next week students will walk their parents upstairs and parents can take a tour of the school floors.

b) Graduation

Virtual graduations for Kindergarten, 4th grade and 8th grade. All students will be remote on those days. If parents have no childcare options and need to bring their children to school, they can (staff will be available). In-person celebrations this year will be slightly different to the usual in-person events -











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there will be assigned times for students to pick up memorabilia, take photos with teachers, sign year books, mini outdoor graduation for 8th grade.

Regarding the school based options (SBO's) mentioned in the UFT report, Ali explained that this is where the staff and school administration can agree to modify certain aspects of the teachers' contract. They are currently surveying staff on which things they would like to consider. They then meet with Sonita and take a vote (55% vote in favor to pass any motions). One item likely to be considered is moving the virtual parent-teacher conferences to one day.

A parent noted this can make it challenging for parents to attend if they have students at the upper and lower division campuses. Ali thanked the parent for the feedback and noted that it shouldn't be an issue this year since the conferences will be virtual.

Eligibility was based on either a nomination submitted by the child's current pre-K teacher or a remote interview conducted by the Department of Education.
