1. Call to Order

A general reminder was noted that the SLT can go into Executive Session if confidential discussions are required in the future.

Following up on a question raised at the last meeting, Sonita confirmed with her contact at the DOE that we have the correct balance of SLT members between staff and parents/guardians (when including her as a staff member) and so the composition of the SLT can remain as it is.

Jean shared her "Story of Me", going through her background, family, personal history and education/teaching journey. We will rotate the "Story of Me" sharing exercise across the SLT Committee members over the course of this year's meetings.

Jean nominated Sue to share her "Story of Me" in the next meeting.



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2. Review and approval of October 18, 2021 SLT meeting minutes

The draft minutes from the October 18, 2021 SLT meeting had been shared in advance. <u>A motion was made</u> to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded. All were in favor; none abstained.

The approved minutes will be published on the school and PTA websites.

3. Presentation from Arts Connection – Ed Miller (in attendance for this section)

The goals of the Arts Connection residency at Q300 are to provide music, visual arts and theater programming that supports literacy, communication, creativity, collaboration and critical thinking in a socially just learning environment for all participants.

- Music K, 1st & 2nd hand instruments to learn about rhythm, vocal music and percussion.
- Visual Arts K, 1st & 2nd drawing with pencils, pens, markers, colored pencils, paper, scissors, glue, tape.
- Music 3rd & 4th drumming and ukulele.
- Theater 3rd Storytelling story creation using visual arts aspects, music and basic acting techniques.
- Theater 4th Shadow Puppetry students will learn how to make backgrounds and shadow puppets, practice improvisation, learn character development and create a group shadow puppet show.
- Music 5th Guitar musicality, parts of the instrument, and learning to play the guitar.

Ed was thanked for his presentation and invited to attend an upcoming PTA meeting to present to the broader school community.

4. Special Education Recovery Program

The DOE has asked all schools to create a program, before or after school, to help support special education students to meet their learning goals. This program will be in addition to support those students are receiving during the day as part of their IEP. Participation in The Special Education Recovery Program is not mandatory, so parents who are contacted about the program may choose to opt their child out.

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5. SEL Screener – Rachel Weiss (in attendance for this section)

This year the DOE has implemented the DESSA screener for Social Emotional Learning (SEL). Edwin, Khary and Rachel will be the SEL team looking at the results and creating action plans for our students in need.

The screener is intended to be strengths-based assessment and the goal is to use social-emotional information about our students to work out what we want to see more of, and where we have needs/gaps. To maintain objectivity, a sample of students may be assessed by more than one teacher.

Staff are participating in an asynchronous professional development session tomorrow on how to do the assessment, how the school will use the data to move forward and also how to use any resources that may become available to us to help fill SEL needs.

Q: How is the assessment performed? A: It is a digital assessment (on an app) done by the teachers.

Q: Where can parents find more information about the SEL screener? A: Website - https://info.apertureed.com/strongresilientnyc

Q: Can parents receive information on the assessment for their child? A: This might be possible, but we are still getting more information. We assume there may be a parent report, but this needs to be confirmed.

Q: What happens with the data?

A: The data will be stored by the school and accessible only by the school. Sonita will have access to the whole school results, and teachers will have access to the findings for their students.

Q: Will you use the data to identify needs across the school, or identify needs for specific students/individuals?

A: The school envisages that it will be a combination of both. This would be similar to our current process where we assess needs using a tiered process - Tier 1 is whole school, Tier 2 is where we need specific attention for individual students and Tier 3 is where we refer students for specific interventions.

One parent shared with the SLT Committee that they had opted their children out of the SEL assessment. They did not feel that the questions were strengthbased and questioned whether the teachers can answer the questions this early in this year. The parent noted that Q300 had performed an SEL assessment in the past where students self-assessed and teachers assessed - a



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subcommittee of the SLT worked on this, and researched a variety of valid metrics out there, and created a survey (which was then vetted by all) that was more specific to our school and its needs around school culture. The SLT Committee at the time found that it provided very useful information that then helped plan the CEP for the next year. The question was posed whether something like this is possible to consider again as an SLT?

6. Q300 Enrollment (2019-2020)

Addressing a query raised in the last SLT meeting, Sonita noted that information about Kindergarten enrollment (specifically diversity information) is not available yet. However, the following website contains publicly available information on the 2019/2020 composition of the school:

For both ELA and Math, a high percentage of our students in each grade scored a Level 3 or Level 4 proficiency.

The SLT can keep this data in mind when we review and critically assess our CEP goals and action plans.

8. Q&A Session on iReady

Jean shared her screen to show a sample iReady testing report, that is going to be released to parents. Teachers participated in a professional development session on how to read and interpret the iReady reports.

These reports have been sent home with students today with some information, parents/guardians can reach out to their child's teachers to discuss.

9. Conversations about G&T announcement

On October 27, 2021, Dr. Composto led a webinar with the Q300 community to open up the conversation regarding the announcement that the existing G&T program will be ending, and replaced with Brilliant NYC. Q&A was collated in advance, and Dr. Composto responded to questions where he could. Dr.



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Composto reassured parents that Q300 will continue as a school. On November 22, 2021 there will be a broader District 30 family engagement session to discuss and share ideas.

Parents have reached out to the PTA Board and the school with varied views across the community. The SLT discussed how we can be proactive in gathering views and information, so we can be ready to start engaging in the process in a way that aligns with the mission, core values and vision of the school, regardless of the admissions criteria news. It was noted that there is still a lot up in the air. Parents/guardians are encouraged to attend the November 22nd meeting. Following that, the December/January timeframe may be a good time to start mobilizing as a community.
