1. Call to Order

The meeting was opened at 4.35pm.

Fiona shared her "Story of Me", going through her background, family, personal history and professional background. We will rotate the "Story of Me" sharing exercise across the SLT Committee members over the course of this year's meetings.

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2. Review and approval of April 7, 2022 SLT meeting minutes

The draft minutes from the April 7, 2022 SLT meeting had been shared in advance and were reviewed again in the meeting. A motion was made to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded. All were in favor; none abstained.

3. SLT Student Report (Julia Leopando)

The Student Council is working on:

Students are asking whether we can have a Talent Show in person, or if not, can we organize a virtual show. Sonita is looking into it.

4. Discussing the next CEP goals based on the data analysis

Review of the Priority Needs from the Comprehensive Needs Assessment Analysis and draft next year's CEP goals

The SLT divided into small groups to review this past year's CEP goals and draft next year's CEP goals:

ELA: Jean, Alisha

Math: Fiona, Julia, Sonita Science: Ali, Dragos, Maria

SEL: Laura, Sue

5. Share out of Draft CEP

ELA share-out: Propose to update this year's CEP goal for next year to emphasize that curriculum should be modified to ensure all students are improving at their own pace, and based on their needs (differentiated goals). Also adding having a shared collective document to give access to students' previous year's academic progress.













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Math share-out: Focusing next year's CEP goals on algebraic thinking and geometric concepts (prior year was only algebraic thinking), based on the comprehensive needs assessment that identified geometric concepts as a development area. Continued focus on solving real world problems and explaining mathematical reasoning behind answers.

Science share-out: Propose to update the CEP goals for next year to include horizontal and vertical subject planning, as well as developing collaboration and inquiry skills at a school-wide exhibitions (e.g. Science Fair). Science curriculum to reflect grade-level content as well as cross-cutting themes across grades.

<u>SEL share-out</u>: Propose to focus the CEP goals next year on relationship-building and optimistic thinking since these areas came up as areas needing improvement in the DESSA competencies testing. Mixed-grade advisories would help build cross-grade relationships. Also (COVID protocols permitting), more focus on hands-on group projects to increase collaboration and relationship-building.

6. **Diversity Proposal Review**

The Diversity Proposal for 2022/2023 school year admissions will be based on the 2021/2022 Proposal. The Proposal aims to increase underrepresented populations in our school and increase diversity and inclusion by prioritizing 40% of incoming Kindergarten seats to students who qualify for free/reduced lunch and/or reside in citywide section 8 housing, citywide NYCHA or citywide temporary housing. The SLT reviewed the document and then discussed and asked questions:

Question: Does the proposal apply before or after sibling priority. Answer: It should work together. Some siblings also qualify under the Diversity Proposal. In the last school year, all siblings who qualified got into the school.

Question: How was the proposal developed, and did the SLT serve as an ad hoc Diversity Committee last year?

Answer: Last year we had a Diversity Committee made up of staff and parents, many of whom helped with marketing our program to the community.

Question: Can we get the Diversity Committee started again? Answer: Yes, we will be starting this up again in Fall 2022, and will be calling on parents who are looking to help our school in this mission.













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Question: Can we put the Diversity Proposal on the school website? Answer: We can develop something to put up on the website to let the community know. Sonita can pass it by the Office of Enrolment.

Question: Should we provide information to families on the G&T nomination process and where they can get more information?

Answer: This sits with the Office of Enrolment and the Pre-K centers, but we should provide information about how to navigate the process once they get an admissions letter. Sonita will ask the Office of Enrolment how they distributed information this year – the window was short.

Question: How do children who are not in a pre-K program get included in the admissions process?

Answer: They need to apply for an assessment through the Office of Enrolment.

7. **Reports**

Principal's Report a.

1) G&T Admissions Update

Pre-K teachers nominate students for consideration to apply for G&T entry. Students not in a Pre-K program need to apply for an assessment through the Office of Enrolment. Families who receive a letter of eligibility can then apply to schools. The offer letters are being sent out in July 2022 by the Office of Enrolment.

2) COVID-19 update

COVID-19 cases have been increasing recently across the city. Parents who want their children to wear a mask at school need to have conversations with their children – it is hard for the teachers to police mask-wearing at school given it is not mandatory.

Parents should use the tests sent home to test their children when they receive a case notification/letter of exposure, to help reduce the spread.

3) Parent Engagement Night

On May 18th we are holding a virtual Parent Engagement Night to discuss curriculum for each grade for the next school year. PowerPoint presentations from the teachers will be sent out for those not able to attend.
