1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 5.33pm.

2. Review and approval of April 22, 2021 SLT meeting minutes

The draft minutes from the April 22, 2021 meeting had been shared in advance. A motion was made to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded. All were in favor; none abstained.

The approved minutes will be published on the school and PTA websites.

3. Presentation from Kaylie from LGBT Network

The school is working with the LGBT Network to implement parenting workshops (all grades) and workshops for 5th to 8th grade students.

The workshops (called LGBT 101) are a basic introduction to what it means to be LGBT and will discuss various topics such as gender identity, stereotypes, inclusion and the importance of using the right pronouns. The presenters do not try to change minds or force opinions – the program's goal is to educate and provide a safe space to ask questions. The parenting workshops also aim to provide language for parents to use when having conversations with their kids.















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Other resources provided by the LGBT Network include a recommended book list and a free monthly parent support group.

Sessions will be tailored/modified for each grade so they are age-appropriate. The session will be comprised of a presentation with participation, questions and answers, so it is interactive.

4. Instructional Focus for 2021-2022:

The instructional focus for 2021-2022 for Q300 is: If we collect and analyze data through multiple methods, teachers will be able to use that data to drive instruction and differentiate to meet students on their levels.

It is important for us to collect the data and take our time with this goal over the next few years, to help bridge gaps that have come out from this pandemic. This instructional focus has been discussed with staff and everyone was on board.

Note that the Instructional Focus is an internal tool – and does not specifically go into the CEP.

Parent members of the SLT suggested including social-emotional and inquirybased learning in the instructional focus.

5. Review and develop action steps 2021-2022 school year:

The SLT Committee broke out into small groups to go through the action steps developed over the last few months, and add, edit or alter the action steps as needed.

Staffing Updates a.

d. School Supplies

- Kindergarten through 4th grade supplies will be delivered to the school as supplies are generally shared.
- 5th to 8th grade supplies will be sent to students' homes as the supplies are used by the individual students.

G & T Admissions e.

- No updates the waitlist has not been released to the school yet.
- Q300 is preparing for mid-late June for registration of 1st 3rd grade students and August registration for Kindergarten.
- We will also have some 6th grade incoming students.
- Middle School will have one ICT and one general education class for each of 6th grade and 7th grade, and 8th grade will have one ICT class and two general education classes.

f. Summer Rising

Q300 is now is now showing up on the website. The program for our school will be at PS 234 (for elementary school grades) and IS126 (for middle school grades). Families can register at other school sites, if they choose. IS126 has two organizations who are working together for the Summer Rising program - YMCA and Global Kids.

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APPENDIX 1 – Principal's report – MAY 25, 2021 SLT

<u>Updates for Reopening 2021-2022 as per Chancellor:</u>

The chancellor shared with all principals and DOE staff members some expectations for next year. We do not have all the information as of yet to envision what a day would look like next year, but this is what we do know as of right now:

- · All students, all teachers and staff will return to school in-person this fall.
- · There will be no fully remote positions in the fall. COVID-related remote work accommodations for school-based employees will not be available next school year. However, our regular application for reasonable accommodations will continue to be available for employees.
- · Masks will continue to be a requirement in all DOE buildings.
- · Individuals with any COVID-19 symptoms will continue to be required to stay home.
- · Students, teachers, and staff will continue to complete the daily health screener at home.
- · Every school building will continue to have an assigned nurse.
- · We will continue to ensure all ventilation systems are working in every classroom.
- · On-site COVID-19 testing will continue in school buildings as recommended by applicable health guidance.
- · The Situation Room will continue to support schools in the management of positive cases, following the applicable health guidance.

RESO-A Grant for the 2021 school year:

We received another Reso-a grant for more technology. We got approximately 50,000 dollars to spend on laptops for both UD and LD. I will be working to setup a meeting to discuss options. We are still awaiting the laptops from the 2020 grant.

Graduations 2021:

All graduations and Moving-up ceremonies this year will have both a virtual and inperson pick-up component. We have decided to do this so we are inclusive to all families, staff, and students. Teachers have reached out to all families and notified them of the plan. We thank everyone for their flexibility during this unpredictable year.

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Social Emotional Focus for June:

June is LGBTQ awareness month and recognition of Juneteenth. In honor of Pride Month and LGBTQ Awareness Month, we have connected with the LGBT network to do a mini-presentation for students in grades 5th through 8th. These presentations will be optional for students to attend. During morning meeting and Advisory, students will be engaged in conversations to learn about Juneteenth.

Career Week: June 14:

Both campuses will be engaged in Career Day during this week. Rachel, Khary and Christine will share more information with parents shortly. We are in the process of surveying parents who would like to present to the LD or UD.

- 1. Fully Reopen Next Year: As you all probably know, we will be fully reopen next year with no remote option.
- 2. Medical Accommodations: Any medical accommodations that have been granted this school year will expire on June 30. With vaccines now available, it is not anticipated that the DOE will grant blanket accommodations for high risk populations as it did this school year.
- 3. Carbon Free and Healthy Schools: The Biden administration is pursuing an ambitious \$2 trillion infrastructure plan to tackle climate change. The UFT is part of the Carbon-Free and Healthy Schools Initiative, a coalition of unions in New York City that are working together to make sure that some of these federal funds are used to make our city's schools clean and green.
