- The group discussed the preface & Chapter 1, marking some of the lines/phrases that resonate with them as well as sharing the experiences they've had that allowed them to connect with the central idea of this text.
- A robust discussion ensued. Some highlights and concepts that resonated from the book were:
 - the potential of co-constructing knowledge, projects, and rubrics with students, and adding more student-led conversations and activities (fishbowls, project-based learning, etc...).
 - how personalized instruction was distinct from differentiation and individualization because of the co-construction (teachers and students as co-pilots) and relation aspects of the concept
 - the possibility of guiding students to feel comfortable with making mistakes and taking risks, as it is integral to growth and learning; we discussed how this doesn't just relate to students, but teachers and community as a whole
 - the 16 Habits of mind and how to incorporate more broadly
 - The emphasis on collaboration and how be better community member
 - The potential for student agency and how they can contribute to their own learning (and inspire more learning)
 - The possibility of cross- and trans-disciplinary nature of the work
 - The consideration how measurement and assessment are impacted by these approaches
 - The potential for shifting thinking:
 - Is it happening in the classroom or is it not?
 - How can we shift and reflect on the process?
 - Overall, the excitement about combining all of the pieces together
