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APPENDIX 1 – Principals Report (Sonita Ramkishun) – June 2, 2022 SLT

a. Staffing

Next year we will have 2 maternity leaves and 1 paternity leave within the school year. I have two long term substitutes ready to support those grades. The Vaccine Mandate is still in place. No updates have been shared with principals as of yet in terms of those teaching positions. We have started interviewing potential candidates.

b. Curriculum

Math - Eureka Math; Science - Amplify Science; Social Studies - Passport to Social Studies and Civics for all; ELA - Teacher's College (revamped units and possible coaches for K-5 teachers to norm practices and support pedagogy). Conference institutes for teachers in 6-8

Parent workshop: Thank you to Alisha for working with her grad students to offer these workshops for families. We are looking at the week of June 13 or week of June 20th. Please encourage families to join these workshops.

c. Enrichment (SEM Model)

We are hoping to return to a regular school wide enrichment model for grade 3rd – 8th where students will be given the opportunity to choose enrichment classes they would like to take based on their interest. Teachers usually lead most of these classes by teaching what they are interested in and partner with different Community Based Organizations such as Arts Connection, NY Chess Kids, Center for Architecture, Alvin Ailey, CUNY CAT- Shakespeare festival, and Astoria film festival. Our PTA does a wonderful job helping us fund these enrichments.

d. Admissions K, 1, 2, 3

The G&T applications are open for students to apply for a G&T seat in K, 1st, 2nd and 3rd grades. Students in Kindergarten need to be nominated by a pre-kindergarten teacher in order to be eligible to apply. Students who are applying for 1st – 3rd grade seats need to apply and their eligibility will be checked by the office of enrollment using previous report cards.

Q300 has approximately the following seats available: 50 seats in K, 15 1st grade seats, 10-12 2nd grade seats and 2-3 3rd grade seats.
