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## Appendix 1: Principal's Report

## Budgeting

- Schools will be held harmless for their initial budget allocations which means no school will be getting a lower initial allocation. Schools will either get an increase or stay the same. Based on our enrollment projections for 2023-2024, we did not receive any additional funding.
- Staffing updates:
- As per preference sheets and conversations with staff, James Woo and Greg Bader will no longer be with us and are resigning from the DOE. We wish them the best of luck with their future endeavors. In addition, Christine Katartzis will be applying for a medical hardship transfer which means she will possibly be placed in another school with an elevator next year. This decision is pending. We want to thank James, Greg, and Christine for all their hard work and dedication to our Q300 community.
- Staffing for 2023-2024
- Due to budgeting we will not be able to hire an additional math teacher and social studies teacher for the Upper Division. The bright side is that the current teacher schedules were able to accommodate the $6^{\text {th }}$ and $7^{\text {th }}$ grade Math and Social Studies classes and still be in compliance with the academic policy and teacher contracts
- For the Lower Division, I am looking to hire 2 teachers to support the K-2 band since there was a deficiency of 2 teachers this year.
- Questions asked:
- If we are not getting any budget cuts, how are we losing three positions? Sonita explained we are at a deficit last year but th DOE did not enforce cuts over the years
- Who will cover idle school and high school articulation with Christine gone and not being replaced? Khary.
- If these three people hadn't resigned, what would have happened? Sonita shared that she is unsure what the DOE would have made her do in terms of budget, but potentially it could have led to excessing some teachers or staff.
- How will this affect the debate and math team programs? Sonita is hoping that she will be able to maintain these programs

Curriculum

- Math: We will continue using Eureka Math for grades K-5 and teacher created materials for 6 th $-8^{\text {th }}$ with a supplement program called Desmos.
- ELA: K-5 will be transitioning to HMH Into Reading which is focused on the Science of Reading. We will


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continue to use Teacher's College Writing Units. $6^{\text {th }}$ through $8^{\text {th }}$ grade will use teacher created material and culturally responsive text.

- Science: K-8 we will continue to use Amplify Science
- Social Studies: K-8 we will continue to use Passport to Social Studies and Civics for All
- Diagnostic Tool: i-ready, Fountas and Pinnel
- Questions asked:
- When will we get the supplemental books, and how can we differentiate this curriculum for advanced students? Sonita said we can use the books that we have from TC and align them. She also said that we are keeping the writing portion of TC for next year as we acclimate to the new reading. Maria and Leanne have developed a Module curriculum to share with others. Laura also shared with the SLT how she and Jean selected and aligned new books this year for 7th and 6th.


## Bell Schedule

Bell Schedule for the Lower Division will remain the same for next year. The Bell Schedule for Upper Division will be changing next year. The start time will be $8: 30 \mathrm{am}$ and the end time will be $2: 50 \mathrm{pm}$. This will help us maximize our whole school PD time and end on Mondays and Tuesdays before 4 pm . In addition, there is no SBO process this year to vote on ending school after 4pm for teachers.
